Dear Parents/Guardians:

In District 46, we believe that Goal Setting and taking steps to accomplish goals are an important life lesson for students. For our K-4 students, Goal Setting will be incorporated into weekly classroom instruction. Our hope is that this process will help each child build confidence along with improve their academic abilities. This fall, each class learned about what a goal is, how to set a goal and create an action plan. They also learned about celebrating success and revising goals (when needed). As a result of this shared learning experience and available student data, each teacher, along with your child, has identified some of your child's individual strengths, as well as one or two academic or personal goals. You will find this information attached to this letter. As the year progresses, the goals will change from being teacher directed to having students take more individual ownership of their goals. You will also have an opportunity to discuss your child's goals with their teacher during Parent-Teacher Conferences.
